Groups and their role in communication

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Abstract. Working in groups is becoming more common today. Individuals work together in groups on a daily basis to perform a task more efficiently and quickly. Very often the term of a group is equated with the term of teams, but it must be kept in mind that not every group can become a team because its members did not meet for the same reasons. Members of an effective team are gathered together to achieve a common goal, while the main goal of working in groups is to exchange information. Thus, the theoretical part refers to differences between groups and teams. After the survey, key conclusions were made, such as why respondents join groups, what are the biggest shortcomings of working in a group or team that disrupt the harmonious work of individuals within the group, by what characteristics individuals differ from each other, it is desired to determine whether individuals are better at group or individual tasks and whether they prefer to be responsible when performing tasks or they shift this responsibility to other team members and last whether respondents will be more efficient in performing tasks if they are rewarded for their effort, whether it is a material or non-material reward.
